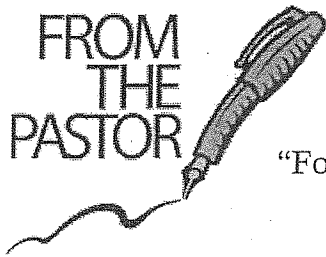

1939 was a year that ended with fear and uncertainty. The Great Depression ground on and World War II was exploding in Europe. What the new year would bring was totally unknown. In that difficult time, King George VI of Great Britain presented his annual Christmas radio broadcast, which included this poem, called "God Knows," (by Minnie L. Haskins) best known for its first stanza:

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

Bldg/Grounds Update

As we close out the year 2011, the Building & Grounds Committee would like to say a heartfelt **“Thank You”** to everyone who has given to the repair projects in our church these past few months. Whether it has been financial support, your time, or your prayers, they are all appreciated. Since our cry for help went out in April, our congregation has pulled together & graciously given approximately \$17,500. That number doesn't recognize the time that has been donated also. With both of these gifts, we have been able to stay within our budget while making the much needed repairs to our building.



Here are our most recent updates.

- Samson Electric has installed heat tape on the east exterior wall of the overflow room, where we have battled the ice glacier in the past few years. Hopefully this will control the ice buildup in this area this winter. If this solves our problem, we will look into new gutters & downspouts in the near future.
- The nursery room repair is complete & looks fabulous. New toys are in the process of being purchased also. A big **‘Thank You’** to Diane Greicar, Barb Collins & Dianne Bossert for all of their work in the nursery. We invite you to stop by & take a look the next time you are at the church.
- We are still waiting on a contractor to install the underground sump pumps around the kitchen area. He will also be installing some attic vents as a continued defense against the ice glacier. Black dirt has been hauled in & leveled out around the building. Grass will be planted in the Spring.

As we look towards 2012, we begin the year with a small surplus in our budget carried over from last year & hope to continue our maintenance and repairs to the church building, along with some possible projects at the parsonage. We encourage you to attend our church's annual meeting on Sunday, January 22, 2012 or pick up an annual

meeting report at the church to familiarize yourself with our budget & where your money is being used.

Please continue to give as you can to our church building, so that we can continue the general maintenance needed to hand down our wonderful place of worship to future generations.

Update

Conversation with Zion Lutheran

Following the loss of their pastor last May, and with the closing of the South Trinity congregation this fall, Zion Lutheran Church, rural Hoople, feels that it needs to find a new means for pastoral leadership. They have sought conversation with the ELCA churches in Grafton, and have approached us at Our Saviour's as well.

At this point the Grafton churches have withdrawn from these conversations. In light of the Grafton churches' decision, our church council has indicated a willingness to continue discussions with Zion to consider ways in which our congregation might cooperate with them. Our Synod office has indicated that there may be a number of forms this could take, with varying degrees of involvement from us at Our Saviour's. The general thought of our council is that, as part of the Body of Christ, we need to be open to consider possibilities of helping a neighboring congregation in ministry; what strengthens part of the Body, strengthens the whole Body.

If and when any specific proposals are raised these will be presented to both congregations for further consideration. If you have any questions about this matter please talk to a church council member or Pastor Jeff.

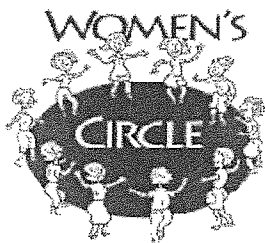

The library committee met on December 13th.

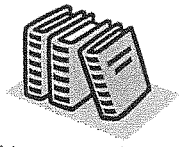

We had a great hot dish for our meal and I've gotten several requests for the recipe, so here it is:

Chicken Supreme

3 c. chicken, cooked & cut up
1 – 7 oz. pkg. creamettes, uncooked
2 cans cr. of mushroom soup
1 c. mushrooms (bits & pieces)
1 sm. onion, chopped
½ c. slivered almonds (optional)
4 hard-boiled eggs, cut up
8 oz. shredded cheddar cheese
1 c. milk
1 c. chicken broth
Pimento & Gr. Pepper for color (may use gr. olives w/pimento-about ½ c.)

Mix all ingredients – put in a 9 x 13 pan – cover & refrigerate overnight.

Important: remove from fridge 1 hr. before baking.

Sprinkle dry bread crumbs on top.

Bake uncovered 1 hr. to 1 ¼ hrs. @ 350 degrees.

Let sit awhile – cut into squares.

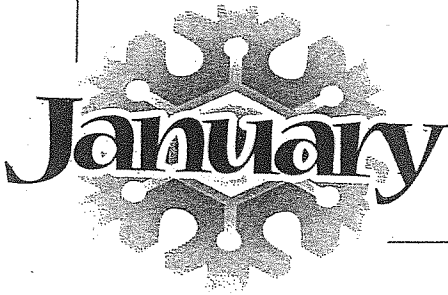
