From the Pastor

Reformation Day comes amidst Halloween and harvest and is easily overlooked. On this day, as Lutherans, we celebrate the work of the Reformers of the Church and their reclaiming the Gospel that had become obscured by human laws and traditions in the medieval church. In their disagreements with some of the practices and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church of that time, the Reformers spoke out and "protested," often to their own peril. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted his "95 Theses" (statements) on the "castle church" door in Wittenberg, Germany. As a priest and scholar, Luther hoped to debate certain church teachings and practices. Needless to say Luther's "protests" were not welcomed. In time he was branded a heretic and an outlaw and was excommunicated from the Roman Church. The times and issues were difficult and complex, not unlike our own times.

Five Latin phrases emerged during the Protestant Reformation that summarize the Reformers' basic theological beliefs in contrast to the teaching of the Roman Catholic Church of the day, known as the "Five Solas." The Latin word *sola* means "alone" or "only" in English. The five *solas* expressed five fundamental beliefs of the Protestant Reformation, pillars which the Reformers believed to be essentials of the Christian life and practice. All five, not one, continue to be at the heart of the Lutheran understanding of the Christian faith.

Sola Gratia
Grace Alone

Sola Fide
Faith Alone

Sola Scriptura
Scripture Alone

- Sola scriptura ("by Scripture alone")
- Sola fide ("by faith alone")
- Sola gratia ("by grace alone")
- Solus Christus or Solo Christo ("Christ alone" or "through Christ alone")
- Soli Deo gloria ("glory to God alone")

Life continues to present challenges and questions to believers and to the Church. As in the days of the Reformation, the Holy Spirit continues to be at work among and through God's people. Desiring to be faithful to the Triune God, the essentials of the Christian life and practice are expressed well in the Five Solas: Scripture alone, by faith alone, by grace alone, through Christ alone, glory to God alone!

As you live out your faith as part of a church that is "reformed and always reforming," may your faith and life be directed by these "Five Onlys."

What you need:

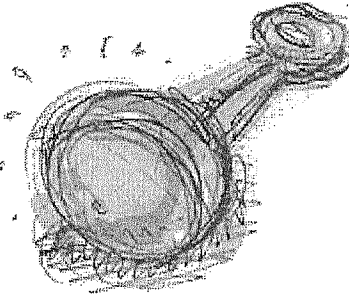
- An adult to help
- 1 roll of sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Cookie sheet
- Wooden craft sticks
- Frosting
- Sprinkles
- Cellophane treat bags

What you do:

1. Freeze the roll of dough.
2. Cut dough into 1/4-inch slices.
3. Place slices 2 inches apart on cookie sheet.
4. Bake at 350 degrees for five minutes.
5. Remove cookies from oven and place a stick into the bottom of each cookie (about 1 inch into the dough).
6. Return cookies to the oven until done, three to five more minutes.
7. After cookies are cool, make a "face" on each one, using frosting and sprinkles.
8. Put cookies into bags and tie with a ribbon. Then give away these edible smiles!

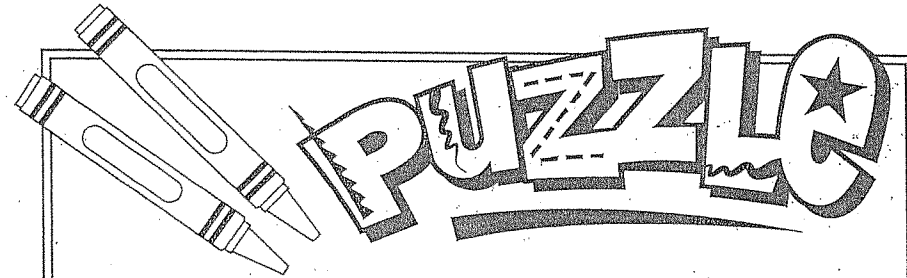
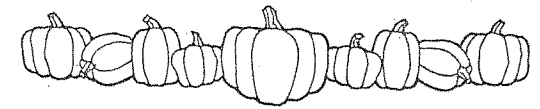

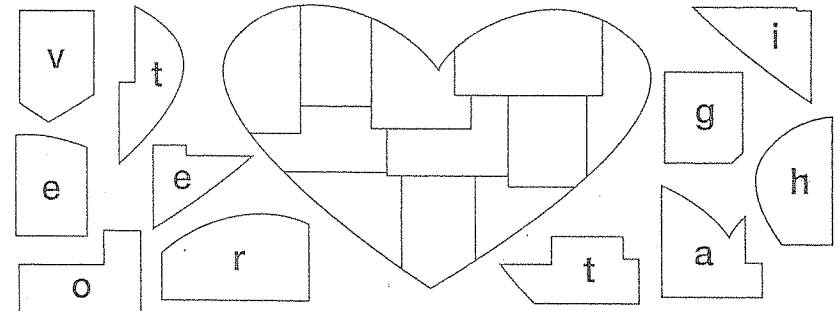


HOW TO GIVE

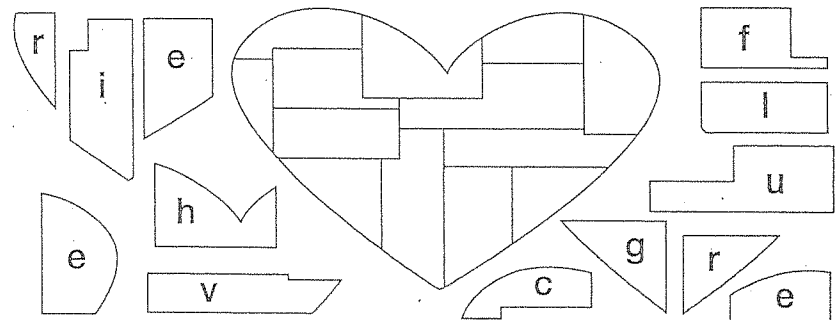
We can give in a variety of ways, including our money, possessions and time. But God says there's only one attitude to have when we give.

Greetings!

It seems like forever since I've written something for the newsletter after working out at the Bible Camp all summer. In some odd way, now that I'm back in the Youth office, I don't mind that the weather isn't nearly as sunny and warm as it was just a couple weeks ago. Must be something about having to be indoors to plan and celebrate the few warm days we (sadly) have left before the next seven months of "not-summer."



Anyway, down to business. There are quite a few happenings going on with the youth lately. On September 28th, students at Park River High School gathered together along with thousands of other students at their schools around the country and prayed for the world at the national date for See You at the Pole.

This month, our youth will be having a couple fundraisers. There will be a bake sale after the church service on October 16th where you are welcome to come and pick up a plate of goodies for your afternoon snack and help support the youth ministry of the church! Also, keep an eye open for a car wash that'll happen on a weekend if the weather is favorable. The Service fundraiser will also be making a return this year with some new services. If you or someone you know needs any help with yard work, home maintenance, grocery shopping, shoveling snow, or anything else. Please contact the church or me personally and we'll work out the details so our youth can experience servanthood in their personal ministries but also help another person and raise money for the upcoming mission trip and other youth events.

Speaking of a mission trip, we are looking at working with Youth Works to take a mission trip this upcoming summer. It'll be a weeklong trip to one of several different locations in the upper Midwest to give our youth a chance to learn more about faith and experience something completely new and develop areas of their life they didn't even know existed.

Also happening this month, the youth will be going to a Third Day and Tenth Avenue North concert in Fargo. The cost is \$30 to cover the ticket and transportation. A \$20 deposit is due by October 2nd, but there may still be opportunities to sign up if you contact me ASAP. Another event that we're looking at is a choral gathering of the upper Midwest called "Sounds Like Love." St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Mahtomedi, MN will be hosting the retreat. The cost is \$100 total, but the church will pay half making the final cost to any 9th-12th grade student interested only \$50.

As we start moving into the winter months, more of the youth ministry will be taking place in the physical building of the church and ideally, the youth room. The youth room is a great facility, but is in need of some love. Two major things it could use are a "new to us" television and a DVD player with a remote. The color in the television picture is doing some odd things at times and the DVD player won't always turn on or read discs as it should. Also, we could use anything to help bring life there once again. So, if you know of a television or a DVD player that works great but needs to be gotten rid of or a collection of board games, Christian music, or anything else that could bring more fun to a youth room, please contact me and we'll talk.

The Youth of the church could use your help! With all the upcoming events and activities, we are in need of helpful adults with a heart for kids to help be chaperones on trips or to help with Youth Groups and other areas of the youth ministry. The parents and families are the single strongest influence in the life of a youth and mentorship from adults can shape and minister to a youth in ways that I as a youth director, could never hope to. So, if you are interested in helping with any aspect of the youth ministry, please feel free to stop by my office and share your thoughts!

Whew...that was quite a bit of typing. Thanks for reading along and I pray that you all have a blessed October and thank you for the continuing love and support you as a congregation have shown the youth of our church.

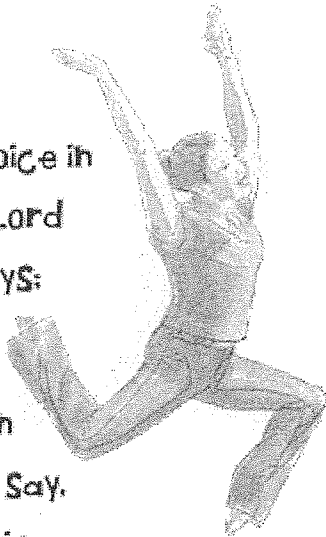

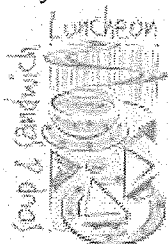

The Latin phrase *Ecclesia semper reformanda est* means “The church is always reforming”; implied is “And that’s good!”

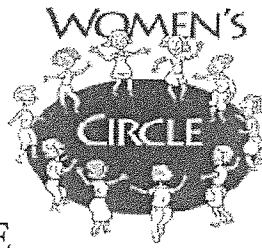


Ongoing change and growth are important for individuals, too, but for many of us, change is hard. Use this prayer poem to embrace positive change, safe in the arms of our unchanging God.

LIBRARY NEWS

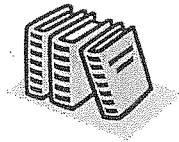

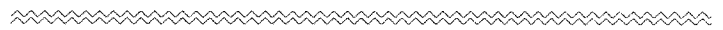

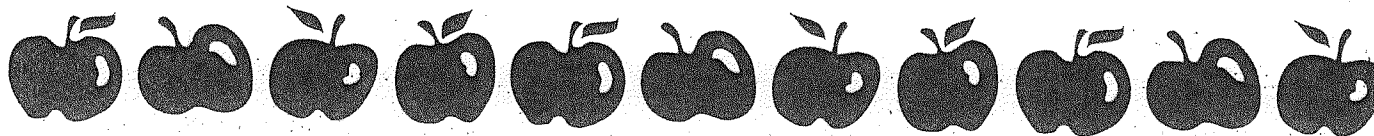
Fall in Love All Over Again!
